EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE RESPONDS TO FLOODING IN WAVERLY, TENNESSEE

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) is responding with volunteers and equipment to the disastrous flooding that occurred in Humphrey’s County, Tennessee.

“Flooding causes overwhelming devastation to a community, so much more so when it brings about the heartbreaking losses of precious life. We mourn with those in Waverly and the surrounding areas,” says Stephen Tybor III, EDOH CEO and President. “We are bringing volunteers and equipment from across the country to serve those impacted by the flooding, and hopefully, to bring light in a place of such suffering and loss.”

EDOH will be deploying its rapid response equipment from its headquarters in Tupelo, Mississippi. This equipment will help volunteers muck-out homes—removing water damage and leaving them to properly dry out to reduce the probability of mold.

EDOH will be headquartered at Trace Creek Baptist Church (1328 HWY 70, New Johnsonville, TN). Volunteering will run from Friday, August 27 to Saturday, September 11. Registration for volunteering opens at www.eightdaysofhope.com starting today, August 23. The first day of volunteering is Friday, August 27.
