EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE RESPONDS TO FLOODING – WATER EMERGENCY IN JACKSON, MS

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) is going to be delivering truckloads of drinking water to those who have been without due to the flooding in the Jackson, Mississippi, area. They are excited to partner with a few local churches to distribute the water in the community.

On the week of August 22, 2022, the Jackson area began receiving much rainfall, causing the water to rise above the capacity the Pearl River could hold, which affected their water treatment plant. Those who have been impacted are currently without reliable water sources.

There is a possibility that EDOH will be deploying its feeding equipment from its headquarters in Tupelo, Mississippi. More details to come.

“With our national headquarters in Mississippi, we can’t ignore the fact that there is a need of water just three hours down the road,” shares EDOH CEO and President Steve Tybor, “We will be sending multiple truckloads of water to the Jackson, MS, area to local churches as they love on their community. We are also considering the need of those who may need food.”
