Tupelo, MS – On Wednesday, September 28, Hurricane Ian made landfall in Southwest Florida. Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) will be deploying its heavy equipment, laundry trailer, kitchen trailer, and shower trailer to the Sarasota area from October 5th – October 29th.

The storm recorded powerful winds up to 155 mph, along with flooding that rose over ten feet in homes, businesses, and over roads. This multi-stage disaster resulted in trees falling over roads, power outages across the affected areas, and so much more.

“We have been watching this storm very closely,” shares Steve Tybor, “Our team is ready to love and serve our fellow brothers and sisters who have just faced such a massive and disastrous hurricane.”
