EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE RESPONDS TO AMORY, MS, AFTER EF-4 TORNADO SWEPT THROUGH THE SOUTHEAST

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) will be responding in Amory, MS, after the March 24 storm that swept across the South.

On Friday evening, multiple Mississippi counties were devastated from the EF-4 tornado. In one afternoon, the disaster leveled hundreds of homes and businesses, caused over two dozen fatalities, produced widespread power outages, and much more.

"Our heart breaks for the families whose lives have changed forever," shares EDOH President Steve Tybor, "We will be on the ground for at least two weeks, walking step by step with families to provide hope and help.
