EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE'S MASS FEEDING MINISTRY IS DEPLOYING TO SERVE THOSE IMPACTED BY HURRICANE BERYL

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) is responding to the massive power outages caused by the landfall of Category 1 Hurricane Beryl. There are almost 3 million people estimated to be without power across Texas and other southern states.

EDOH's Mass Feeding Ministry is bringing a team of volunteers to the impacted area, outside of Houston. They will remain in the area while needed, providing fresh meals to those impacted, first responders, and other volunteers serving the area.

"So many across Texas have been affected by Hurricane Beryl. And as the storm continues to bring tornado and flood warnings, many families are waiting to see the final impact of the devastation," says Chandler Gurley, EDOH Director of Operations. "We have leaders, volunteers, and equipment already traveling to the impacted areas to provide warm meals as families begin preparing the first steps of their disaster recovery. We hope to provide peace and comfort in the midst of the mess."
