EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE TO DEPLOY IN PENNSYLVANIA FOLLOWING FLOODING FROM HURRICANE DEBBY

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) is deploying its Rapid Response Ministry to Tioga County, PA, following the widespread flooding left behind by Hurricane Debby. An estimated 300 homes and counting have been damaged in Tioga and Potter’s County.

“Our hearts ache for the hundreds of families and communities that are facing immense, devastating flooding after Hurricane Debby,” shared Chandler Gurley, EDOH Director of Operations. “Currently, our team is mobilizing in Pennsylvania to bring hope and help to the hard-hit areas over the next two weeks.”

Volunteering for this outreach is open from Thursday, August 15, until Saturday, August 31. Crews will be sorting debris, gutting homes, providing mold prevention, and more.
