EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE DEPLOYS TO GEORGIA FOLLOWING HURRICANE HELENE

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) is bringing its Rapid Response Ministry to Valdosta, GA, following the devastation left behind by Category 4 Hurricane Helene. This storm brought flash flooding and severe rainfall to many southern states, causing an estimated \$20 billion + in damage. In Valdosta, over 100 homes have been impacted by Hurricane Helene.

“So many across the South are experiencing unimaginable loss. Our hearts are breaking for everyone impacted, especially those whose loved ones have passed,” shared Chandler Gurley, EDOH Director of Operations. “Our volunteers, leaders, and equipment are ready to serve in Valdosta and bring a glimpse of hope in the midst of this disaster.”

EDOH will be serving in the area starting Wednesday, October 2. We will stay through Monday, October 14. Volunteering for this outreach is now open at www.eightdaysofhope.com. Volunteers must be 16+. No training is required. Food and lodging are provided.

EDOH has also deployed its Mass Feeding Ministry to Perry, FL, where over 2,000 meals have been served since the storm hit. We plan to stay in the area until power is restored.
