EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE BRINGS VOLUNTEERS TO NC FOR RAPID RESPONSE DEPLOYMENT

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) is bringing its Rapid Response Ministry to Haywood County, NC, to help flood victims in the aftermath of Hurricane Helene. The storm made landfall as a Category 4, bringing intense damage to several states across the South. North Carolina has been particularly devastated by tragic flooding, which has claimed the lives of many, while leaving homes and infrastructure destroyed.

“Our hope has been to serve in North Carolina since the heartbreaking reports of damage began to appear. We know so many are hurting and waiting to experience hope as the impact of Hurricane Helene grows,” shared Stephen Tybor III, EDOH President and CEO. “We are humbled to bring our volunteers and equipment to Haywood County to help families muck out their homes, sort debris, and most importantly, to remind them that they are not alone in their recovery journey.”

EDOH will be serving in the area starting Wednesday, October 9. We will stay through Saturday, October 26. Volunteering for this outreach is now open at www.eightdaysofhope.com. Volunteers must be 16+. No training is required. Food and lodging are provided.

EDOH’s Mass Feeding Ministry is also serving in Canton, NC, providing warm meals, hot showers, and laundry to residents for free. They plan to stay in the area until the need subsides.
