EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE BRINGS SKILLED VOLUNTEERS TO SC AFTER HURRICANE HELENE

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) is bringing its Rapid Response Ministry to Spartanburg County, SC, to help those impacted by Category 4 Hurricane Helene. Even weeks after the storm made landfall, many across the South are still recovering from Helene’s devastating impact.

This will be a heavy deployment of the Rapid Response arm. A team of highly skilled and trained equipment and chainsaw operators will work to help as many families as possible with tree removal, roof tarping, and more.

“As the weeks continue on, we are heartbroken to hear of the magnitude of damage caused by Hurricane Helene,” shared Stephen Tybor III, EDOH President and CEO. “So much of the South is recovering from both Hurricane Helene and Hurricane Milton. We are ready to serve those in Spartanburg, SC, in any way we can, bringing hope to a community that has not yet had much help.”
