

On March 24, 2023, an EF-3 tornado damaged an estimated 1,500 homes in Amory, MS, leaving almost the entire town impacted by the storm. Immediately after the tornado hit, our Rapid Response Ministry arrived, serving 193 families through the help of over 1,000 volunteers.

In March of 2024, almost a year after the tornado, Eight Days of Hope traveled to Amory, MS, once again, in partnership with the Monroe Strong Long Term Recovery Committee, to love and serve those in need. We were humbled to help many of the same families we encountered during our Rapid Response outreach as they moved one step closer to restoration!

Our volunteers served 122 families in Monroe County, including those in Amory, Aberdeen, Hatley, and Smithville. 1,706 volunteers from 39 states and 2 countries provided 22 families with roofs, 28 families with freshly painted homes, and 62 families with move-in ready homes! Over \$4 million of work was completed, but more importantly, many people came to know Christ, including some of our precious volunteers.





















BUFFALO, NY | LAKE-EFFECT SNOW January 19 to January 23, 2024

Parts of Western New York received an estimated 8 feet of lake-effect snow accumulation over the course of several days. People were desperate to be unburied from the massive drifts. Our Rapid Response Heavy team deployed to the area, and for five days, 33 volunteers provided snow removal for 88 families as they worked to safely leave their homes.

SLIDELL, LA | TORNADO April 12 to April 19, 2024

In early spring, an EF-2 tornado completely devastated the town of Slidell, LA. Our Rapid Response Heavy team deployed to the area with a specialized crew of skilled chainsaw and equipment operators to best meet the community's need for intense tree removal. 14 volunteers spent the week serving 39 families, restoring hope to those who were hurting.



OMAHA, NE | TORNADO April 28 to May 11, 2024

Our Rapid Response Heavy team deployed to Omaha, NE, after an intense outbreak of tornadoes damaged hundreds of homes across several states in the Midwest. The need was greater than we originally thought, turning this outreach into a full Rapid Response deployment. 61 volunteers served 47 families with tree removal, roof tarping, debris clean up, and more.





CLEVELAND, TX | FLOODING May 14 to May 25, 2024

146 volunteers gathered to serve in Cleveland, TX, after several weeks of consistent rainfall led to massive flooding in the area. While there, a derecho hit, taking out powerlines and trees, multiplying the damage. Our team was able to respond immediately, helping the local community clear roads and more. Overall, 39 families experienced hope in the face of widespread disaster.

TEMPLE, TX | TORNADO May 28 to June 8, 2024

Two tornadoes struck Bell County, TX, on the same evening. The paths of destruction ravaged the towns of Temple and Belton. Our Rapid Response Ministry deployed to the area, bringing 210 volunteers to love and serve those impacted – including many local volunteers. Throughout this outreach, 75 families were touched, as hope spread throughout the county!



















SHELDON, IA | FLOODING June 27 to July 10, 2024

Intense rainfall accumulated over several weeks in lowa, causing a levee to break, which catastrophically flooded Sheldon, IA, and the surrounding areas. Our Rapid Response team brought 190 volunteers to serve the communities impacted by the flooding. Together, they mucked homes, removed debris, and shared hope with 86 families who were hurting.





TIOGA COUNTY, PA | HURRICANE DEBBY August 15 to August 31, 2024

God met us in the mountains of Tioga County, PA, where 187 volunteers joined our Rapid Response Ministry to serve 82 families in need. Hurricane Debby left unexpected widespread flooding in the area after the storm traveled across the Northeast. The community felt forgotten, but after the help of EDOH volunteers, they felt everlasting hope.

MASS FEEDING



SULPHUR, OK | TORNADO August 28 to May 3, 2024

We deployed to Sulphur, OK, following a devastating outbreak of tornadoes that spanned much of the Midwest. For days, the storms ravaged towns across several states, leaving hundreds of thousands without power. Our Mass Feeding Ministry served over 1,000 meals to families in need, first responders, and volunteers.



HOUSTON, TX | HURRICANE BERYL July 10 to July 14, 2024

Our Mass Feeding Ministry deployed to Houston, TX, after the Hurricane Beryl made landfall as a Category 1 storm. While power was being restored, we provided 6,100 meals through 6 churches in the Houston area, including 2 EDOH national partners – Grace Church and the Woodlands Methodist Church.



HOUMA, LA | HURRICANE FRANCINE September 12 to September 16, 2024

Hurricane Francine made landfall as a Category 2 storm, leaving 400,000 people without power. We were waiting just outside the disaster zone, and within 24 hours of the storm passing, began serving meals in Houma, LA. Together with the local church, 49 volunteers served 7,650 meals to those in need.



SARASOTA, FL | HURRICANE MILTON October 11 to October 17, 2024

Hurricane Milton arrived with a force in the Gulf Coast just two weeks after Hurricane Helene. Milton hit just outside of Sarasota, FL, as a Category 3 storm, leaving over 3 million in Florida without power. Our Mass Feeding team responded quickly, providing 7,530 meals to those in need as the community began recovery efforts.



Safe House Build | October & November 2024

Our Safe House Ministry partnered with Mercy Gate Ministries in October and November of 2024 to build a transitional home for women rescued from trafficking. This beautiful house – called Arukah Home – is devoted to the "healing, restoring, and rebuilding" that God does within the lives of survivors.

We had an amazing team of volunteers, and in just 23 days, Arukah Home blossomed from a simple foundation to a place of fellowship and growth. Today, it is ready to serve survivors as they re-enter society, a testament to the restoring work of our God!














SAFE HOUSE PARTNER RETREAT



VALDOSTA, GA October 2 to October 13



HAYWOOD COUNTY, NC October 9 to October 26



SPARTANBURG COUNTY, SC October 23 to November 2

When Hurricane Helene hit, we knew so many hurting families needed help. We first deployed to Valdosta, GA, providing roof tarping, tree removal, and debris clean up to 93 families. While in Valdosta, our second Rapid Response team deployed to Haywood County, NC, where we were able to muck out homes and provide mold remediation for 99 families. During our time in the area, we realized that a local community – Swannanoa – had their water supply corrupted by Helene. Quickly, we purchased a safe water supply, and for six weeks, provided clean drinking water and showers to this community. As we wrapped up in North Carolina, we sent a heavy deployment – which consists of a smaller group of skilled chainsaw and equipment operators – to Spartanburg County, SC, to help with heavy tree removal for 71 families.











DISPLAYING GOD'S GOODNESS

"Our home was spared during Helene, but we had a huge oak tree fall in our backyard, which blocked a neighborhood walking trail. The quote to remove it was a shocking \$15,000! Our homeowner's insurance didn't cover this. I called a friend, telling her about our situation, and an hour later, she met a man named Fred. He was offering tree help through an organization called Eight Days of Hope. My husband and I knew immediately that God had provided this help.

The team of men who came to our house to remove this huge oak were incredible. I was even able to meet Fred. He told me the only reason his team was in that parking lot that day was to make a quick restroom stop! While there, he felt the Lord nudging him to ask the group in the parking lot if they knew anyone who needed their help. Greg and I were immensely blessed by these men, not only for helping us with something we couldn't take care of on our own, but also the way they shared the love of Christ with us. We know our leaning tree was very insignificant on the scale of destruction from Helene, but the clear display of God's goodness is so humbling – even in this little thing."

MASS FEEDING OUTREACHES



PERRY, FL September 28 to October 1



CANTON, NC October 3 to October 9

Within 48 hours of Category 4 Hurricane Helene making landfall just outside of Perry, FL, our team was on the ground providing meals. We had the chance to serve this community until power was restored, distributing 5,296 hot meals to those in need. After leaving Perry, our Mass Feeding team headed to Canton, NC, where intense flooding had left the community inaccessible and without power. First responders were still completing search and rescue. Not only was the community in need of food, but they were desperate for hot showers and clean laundry. During our time in the area, we provided 3,088 meals, washed 196 loads of laundry, and offered many hot showers to families impacted, first responders, and other volunteers serving in the area.











A CHRISTMAS TO REMEMBER

Returning and Loving Families in Valdosta and Haywood County



The road to recovery for those impacted by a disaster like Hurricane Helene is long - often facing unexpected hurdles, expenses, and loss. We knew that those we served in Valdosta and Haywood County would need ongoing encouragement, especially with the holiday season quickly approaching.

We partnered with the local church in each community to host a Christmas dinner for the families we served. Together, we gave away gifts to the families so that they can continue the journey of rebuilding their lives. We are beyond thankful that we were able to be a glimpse of joy during the Christmas season!



SAFE HARBOR OHIO

April & May 2024 Blitz 7 & 8

In the spring, our team headed back to Safe Harbor Ohio to complete this refuge of freedom, wrapping up the remaining tasks over two blitzes.

Volunteers completed everything from finish carpentry to flooring to landscaping. We also installed the tile backsplashes in the kitchens - these beautiful, one-of-a-kind pieces were hand painted by members in the community and across the country, who committed to praying for and supporting the girls who would one day experience healing at Safe Harbor. As the final weeks of this amazing build came to a close, we stood in awe of this beautiful campus - built for free as a beacon of hope in the midst of darkness.

Grand Opening May 23, 2024


The final touches of paint were finished. Every window was washed. The couches sat ready to hold cherished conversations of healing and growth. Though the halls were quiet, the anticipation for what was to come echoed loudly.

On May 23, 2024, over 300 individuals from the community - volunteers, donors, and prayer warriors - gathered to give God the glory as Safe Harbor Ohio officially opened it's doors to serve girls who are rescued from trafficking. Where a field once stood, God built the most intentional place of restoration. Today, we are humbled that, already, precious survivors are receiving the emotional, physical, and spiritual healing that they so desperately need.





















Each year, volunteers from Western New York and across the country gather in July for our annual EDOH - Buffalo outreach. The hope is simple: to unite the local church, businesses, and ministries to love and serve in our community, building a better Buffalo together.

This July, we turned to the Ellicott District in the City of Buffalo, and while the goal was to help 100 families with free home repairs, God moved in mighty ways! He brought together 1,805 volunteers from 37 states and Canada, setting a record in Buffalo for the largest volunteer event in the city's history! Not only did so many volunteers come together, but almost 50 local churches, businesses, and ministries stepped up to support this outreach, proving that Buffalo truly is the City of Good Neighbors.

Throughout the outreach, we saw God bring hope and salvation to far more than we anticipated. 347 families in the Ellicott District received free home repairs, such as roofing, carpentry, painting, landscaping, and more. How thankful we are for the outpouring of God's goodness this summer!




TRAINING & EOUIPPING


