EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE BRINGS HOT MEALS, VOLUNTEERS TO TWO CITIES AFTER TORNADO OUTBREAK

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) is deploying its Rapid Response Ministry to London, KY, and its Mass Feeding Ministry to St. Louis, MO, in the aftermath of the May 16 tornado outbreak that caused devastation across several states in the Ohio Valley.

“Our hearts go out to all those impacted by this tornado outbreak. The damage left behind is not only in the loss of homes, but also in the loss of precious lives,” shared Stephen Tybor III, EDOH President and CEO. “We are humbled to provide meals to the hungry, help to the hurting, and ultimately, hope to everyone we encounter as they walk the long road to recovery in the aftermath of this terrible storm.”

The EDOH Rapid Response Ministry is deploying to London, KY, from Friday, May 23 to Saturday, June 7, offering tree removal, debris clean-up, and more to families impacted by the storm.
