EIGHT DAYS OF HOPE TO DEPLOY TO NORTHEAST MISSISSIPPI DUE TO WINTER STORM FERN

Tupelo, MS – Eight Days of Hope (EDOH) is deploying its Rapid Response Ministry to Oxford, MS, following a devastating ice storm over the weekend. Hundreds of thousands of people are still without power across the country, leaving so many in need.
